I am aware that many of us want to know what is happening with the Presbytery Mission Plan. Let me try my best to explain. In May, the Kirk Session of Orchardhill determined to leave our cluster to form a new cluster with the congregation of Merrylee. Although saddened by this decision, we realise that this is Orchardhill's decision to make.

As a result of this, The Presbytery of Glasgow has "suspended" the plan for our cluster until a new ministry allocation can be determined. This is highly frustrating to all of us but there is not much we can do about this. It may feel that we have become like the Israelites, wandering behind Moses, looking for the Promised Land.

Nevertheless, our cluster continues to work in the background. Social events are being planned and the Ministers will be involved in pulpit swaps on the 29th of September. Other worship events are being planned and will be announced in due course.

So, for now, we get on with the work and the mission of Eastwood Parish Church. Whilst also working with our cluster partners. I will update you again as soon as I can.
